Year 1

- Written Framework
 - Met expectations for the past 11 years
 - Retail enrollment and conformance with Standard 5 obtained, 2023
 - MFRPS enrollment and conformance with Standard 5 obtained, 2024
- IA RRT End of Year Report completed and submitted for review.
 - End of Year Report (July 1, 2023-June 30, 2024)
 - IA RRT is a level 2 RRT, exceeded the minimum of 11 expected goals by addressing a total of 19 goals





Year 1 Cont.

- Iowa RRT has entered a mentorship with Arkansas RRT. The first mentorship meeting was held on March 20, 2024.
- Iowa RRT invited AR RRT to observe the RAGBRAI 2024 ICS annual activation.
- AR RRT has been invited to observe lowa's bi-weekly RRT meeting with our core partners to share updates and ongoing issues.
- Iowa RRT also attended the Arkansas Department of Health RRT Introductory Kickoff on February 29, 2024 and was introduced as AR RRT's mentor.









- Conduct EA Team specific training, specifically a tabletop exercise on understanding the root cause of an outbreak and identifying contributing factors and environmental antecedents.
- Update the environmental assessment procedure for retail firms to use during outbreak investigations
- Train EA Team on enhanced investigation and interview techniques.
- Implement environmental assessment procedures for retail firms to use during outbreak investigations.
- Develop and implement an environmental assessment procedure for manufacture food facilities to use during outbreak investigations






Complaint Response

 Since the launch of the centralized complaint line in 2016, Iowa HHS has received over 2600 illness complaints and investigated over 200 outbreaks








ICS Activations



Storm Response


- Multi-storms, Derecho, tornado, flash flooding, and power outages
- Governor's Proclamation declared for 44 counties
- Activated between 5/22/24 through 5/31/24





Flood Response

- Heavy rainfall caused flooding in several counties in Northwest Iowa
- As this event progressed, counties along the Missouri River and surrounding impacted
- Governor Issued Disaster Proclamation
- Activated between June 22 July 15, 2024









RAGBRAI Response

The IA RRT annual activation occurred between July 20-27, 2024 in response to the 2024 Iowa RAGBRAI, the Register's Annual Great Bicycle Ride Across Iowa.

	which apply to DIAL administrative and general bureau functions. They will serve as the designee f the Bureau Chief.

- Our intent is to create an agenda/checklist and survey that can be duplicated for partial activation responses to collect feedback from all participants to help improve future response activities






