

# Illness Complaint – Iowa HHS


- Established in 2016
- Since the launch of the centralized complaint line in 2016, Iowa HHS has received over 2600 illness complaints and investigated over 200 outbreaks



- **▶** What is the Iowa Rapid Response Team?
  - ► The Iowa Rapid Response Team (RRT) is a multi-agency team that involves interagency collaboration and communication to respond to a food emergency.
- We often use the Incident Command System (ICS) and a Unified Command Structure to respond to human food emergencies



### The FERP

- ► The FERP's purpose is to identify how the State of Iowa will prepare for and conduct a rapid response to significant threats to food safety and public health in coordination with federal and local governments, and also with the private sector.
- ► This FERP does not apply to food incidents of a limited scope that are routinely handled by a local or a state agency of authority.
- This FERP applies to food-related incidents that may involve a high mortality rate, a large number of people in a small area, or that are widespread, involving a number of localities within the State of Iowa, or multiple states.





## The FERP

- ► The FERP encourages multi-agency cooperation to minimize the impact of an unintentional or deliberate incident related to Iowa's food supply and preserve public confidence in food safety.
- ► The overarching goal is protection of public health and ensuring Iowa's agricultural industry and food security through coordinated response and recovery.






